Central Oregon Coast Fire & Rescue District (COCFRD) is located in Waldport, Oregon. The district begins in Waldport, follows the Alsea River corridor up Highway 34, and ends just past milepost 23 on highway 34. COCFRD has three fire stations strategically located in our district. The main station (station 7200) located in Waldport, is at 145 NW Alsea Hwy, the second station (station 7300) is located at 10096 E Alsea Hwy in Tidewater, and the third station (station 7400) is located at 20341 E Alsea Hwy in Alsea.

Central Oregon Coast Fire & Rescue District responds to emergency alarms involving medical, fire, motor vehicle crashes, water and surf rescues, and many others. In 2017, Central Oregon Coast Fire & Rescue District responded to over 1,000 alarms. Central Oregon Coast Fire & Rescue District is a combination department that consists of volunteer and career staff. Volunteer personnel may respond to alarms from the station, their homes, or their work when an alarm is toned out.

Central Oregon Coast Fire & Rescue District supplies all equipment and training needed for all personnel. Our trainings are held on the first, third, and, if applicable, fifth Wednesday evenings. We are also willing to offer training to fit individual and group schedules. It is required for all personnel to attend at least 50% of all training, which we call “drills”. Drills last around 2-3 hours at a time. The fourth Tuesday of each month is when we have our Volunteer Association meeting.

We always have a need for new volunteers to join our agency. Time is required to be a volunteer, however; due to family, work schedules, and other social obligations, your time can vary. Our community values any time that you can give. You can choose to be active in all aspects of the district or in a particular area such as water rescue. We have a real need for volunteer responders in all areas. For those who wish to be in an auxiliary role, we are always seeking photographers, cadet advisors, and auxiliary support staff.
